All projects must deliver one or more of the following listed outcomes in order to be considered for funding. Outputs and outcomes have been grouped by Government into the following categories:

- Business and Community Assets (Blue)
- Enterprises (Yellow)
- Events and Activities (Red)
- People and Users (Green)
- Others (White)

Any outputs and outcomes can fit under any of the 3 UKSPF Themes (Communities & Place, Supporting Local Business, or People & Skills) where appropriate. Please tick all those which are relevant to your project, and include an amount on your main application form. Council Officers will then use these as part of the value for money considerations of your application.

For example, if your project is to refurbish a village hall, you might tick 'Amenities/Facilities created or improved' and 'People reached', then include on your main application form that 1 facility will be improved, and estimate how many people will be reached by having this improved facility, so perhaps 1,000 people reached. For outcomes, you might choose 'Increased users of facilities/amenities' and estimate that the village hall will see an increase of 10% in its users once it has been refurbished. Exact figures are not required; logical, reasonable estimates will be accepted.
