
Community Governance

In 2007 Councils were given responsibility for making decisions about parish arrangements.

Part 4 of the 2007 Act:

Decisions must follow a community governance review

- There are different ways to trigger them such as Council decision, petition or out of a neighbourhood plan process.
- Certain things must be addressed in them such as designating the area, terms of reference, consultation and take account of representations received.
- Publish/inform about recommendations.
- Maximum of 12 months





Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007

Duties when undertaking a review

The principal council must consult the following—

- (a) the **local government electors** for the area under review;
- (b) any other person or body (including a local authority) which appears to the principal council to have an interest in the review.

The principal council must have regard to the **need to secure** that community governance within the area under review—

- (a) reflects the identities and interests of the community in that area, and
- (b) is effective and convenient.



Parking Services



28 of the Councils car parks have retained the Park Mark safer parking award with 13 also gaining the park access award for disabled friendly facilities.

Two further car parks have been assessed for the awards, and they are expected to pass the criteria.

Tendring have the most car parks in the Essex area with the Park Mark award.

The British Parking Association commented on the standard of our car parks:

"Their proactive efforts to continue to add new sites to these initiatives are a testament to their unwavering commitment to provide safe and accessible parking. Their dedication to excellence sets a high standard for what can be achieved with continuous improvement and a genuine concern for the community's wellbeing."

Clacton Leisure Centre Car Park was extended to provide another 11 spaces for users.

This was following a £298k full car park resurfacing project.



Public Realm



Tokley Road play area in Frating was given a £140k face lift using S106 funds making a full accessible facility for residents.



Three new Changing Places facilities have been built around Tendring following a government funding award.

Tendring District Council was given £300,000 from the Department of Levelling Up, Housing and Communities to build the new specialist disabled toilet and changing amenities.

The facilities are located at the Promenade Way car park in Brightlingsea; the Lower Promenade at Holland Haven Country Park; and on the Lower Promenade below Marine Parade East, Clacton, close to Beaches Café.



Nature Conservation









The installation of two new barn owl boxes have resulted in three barn own chicks successfully fledging last year and a brood of four tawny owl chicks fledging this year.

All were successfully measured, weighed and fitted with identity rings.



Coastal Works





October 2024 saw the completion of the Naze short wall gabion works. Works included extending the existing clay ramp by 25 meters using gabion baskets providing protection to the seaward face. A new access ramp was also installed with gabion protection to the cliff either side of the ramp. Work was funded by contributions from the Environment Agency, TDC and the Naze Protection Society.






January 2025 saw the completion of works to fill the void areas at Stone Pier in Harwich. Following numerous repairs by our Engineering service, a survey of the area was completed showing a total of 17 voided areas. A company called Geobear won the contract and filled the voids using a geopolymer resin which was pumped into the voids via drilled holes in the promenade above.



Engineering Services

Cliff Road, Holland on Sea - Cliff drainage. In October 2024, we installed a new cliff drainage system to remove excess water from the cliff that had previously been causing the Cliff to fail and cause water issues on the promenade below.
