IMPENDING XL BULLY DOG BAN

Earlier this year, the Government announced that by the end of 2023 the XL Bully type dog will be added to the breed types already banned in the UK, under The Dangerous Dogs Act 1991. The Government has brought into force legislation to implement the ban on XL Bully dogs, and this explains the transitional period for existing owners.

What you need to do to obtain a Certificate of Exemption for your XL Bully

If you own an XL Bully type dog, it does not mean that you cannot keep your dog. It simply means that **there are a few things you must do**, **by 31st January 2024**, to keep your dog legally.

As the owner of an XL Bully dog, you MUST DO the following before 31st January 2024, after which it will be a criminal offence to own an XL Bully type dog:

- **Get Third Party Public Liability Insurance**, before applying for a Certificate of Exemption as an example, the Dogs Trust are offering this for £25.00 a year https://www.dogstrust.org.uk/support-us/membership
- Apply for a Certificate of Exemption before 31 January 2024, this costs £92.40 per dog www.gov.uk/guidance/apply-for-a-certificate-of-exemption-to-keep-an-xlbully-dog
- Neuter your dog, if it is not already neutered.
 Read <u>www.gov.uk/guidance/prepare-for-the-ban-on-xl-bully-dogs#neutering-an-xl</u> for when you must have your dog neutered. A vet must confirm if your dog is already neutered.
- Your dog must be:
 - Microchipped <u>Compulsory dog microchipping comes into effect -</u> <u>GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u>
 - Kept on a lead and muzzled at all times when in public
 - Kept in a secure place **so it cannot** escape

You as the owner must also:

- Be over 16 years old
- Be able to show the Certificate of Exemption when asked by a Police Officer or a Council Dog Warden, either at the time or within 5 days

From 31st December 2023 it will be against the law to:

- Sell an XL Bully dog
- Abandon an XL Bully dog or let it stray
- Give away an XL Bully dog
- Breed from an XL Bully dog
- Have an XL Bully dog in public without a lead and muzzle

If you do not want to keep your XL Bully Dog:

From 31 December 2023, it will be illegal to rehome, sell or transfer ownership of XL Bully dogs. From this date, rescue and rehoming centres should not rehome XL Bully dogs.

Rehoming centres can decide to:

- keep an XL Bully and apply for a Certificate of Exemption
- euthanise an XL Bully

Rescue and rehoming organisations can claim a £100 contribution towards any euthanasia cost. Compensation must be claimed by 15 March 2024.

Vets may be asked by XL Bully owners to euthanise their dog. Owners can claim £200 per dog. Rescue and rehoming organisations centres can claim £100. The euthanasia must be performed by 31 January 2024. Owners may apply for compensation at **www.gov.uk/government/publications/claim-compensation-for-an-xl-bully-dog** by 15 March 2024.

You can use the Gov.uk - Definition of an XL Bully dog, to confirm if you own an XL Bully dog if you are not sure.

If you are a council housing tenant, you must follow our Pet Policy www.tendringdc.uk/subcontent-pages/living-in-your-home, go to the Pets section and select Keeping Pets in your council home. If you own a dog, you must have applied for permission to keep it in your home if you have not done this, then you must do so via Tendring District Council website, My Tendring, MyTendring Forms and choose Application to keep a pet in my council property, as a matter of urgency.

If we retrospectively grant you permission to keep your XL Bully or you already have permission to keep the dog in your Council home, then **you must meet all the criteria to obtain a Certificate of Exemption (as detailed below) by no later than 31st January 2024** and **send a copy of the Certificate of Exemption to the Housing Team at** <u>housing.services@tendringdc.gov.uk</u> as soon as you receive it.
