## Crag Walk Heritage Project, Walton on the Naze

Tendring District Council have been working in partnership with <u>Essex Wildlife Trust</u>, <u>The</u> <u>Naze Protection Society</u>, <u>The Naze Tower</u> and the owners of Walton Hall Farm and Stone Point on a major £1.2million scheme to help secure the future of Walton's historic Naze.

The project consisted of a 110m long rock structure which provides an educational and public access viewing platform at the southern end of the Naze cliff.

Work has now been completed and the new platform is open to the public. An official Opening Ceremony took place on 25th June 2011 and was a great success.
